
The most valuable thing you build is your life, which could be compared to a skyscraper. No foundation is stronger or steadier than Jesus Christ, so to build wisely, you must...

- Give sacrificially, forgive willingly, and love extravagantly (Acts 2:45; Eph. 4:32; I Peter 1:22). Pride and selfishness have no place in this "building". Using pride and selfishness as construction materials results in a crumbling shack that is easily destroyed.
- Use your gifts to glory God. The Holy Spirit has equipped every believer to serve the Lord. We need to use our time on this earth wisely, glorifying our Father with our talents and resources.
- Share the Gospel. Telling others about Jesus Christ is the greatest service we can offer to God and to our fellow man. The Lord Himself has called us to do this (Matt.28:19)

Christians should not be creating monuments for the world's pleasure. Rather, we should be raising spiritual skyscrapers that reflect God's glory. The truth is, many acts of obedience are only seen by God, but He remembers every grace-filled word and deed, and He intends to reward each one.
