Online Giving

Beginning May 1st, online giving will be available through our website: hardwickbaptist.org by clicking on the "online giving" button at the top of each page. This will be an easy, convenient way to contribute to the church at any time from anywhere on any device or computer. You can use your debit or credit card or pay using your checking or savings account. You can make a one time contribution or set up a recurring (weekly, monthly, etc) contribution.

First you will need to set up an online profile with your personal and banking information. Then choose your payment method, the fund you wish to contribute to, the start date, frequency and amount. Your contribution will then be processed and deposited into the church bank account. The transaction is processed by Vanco, a secure company that we use for our church financial system.

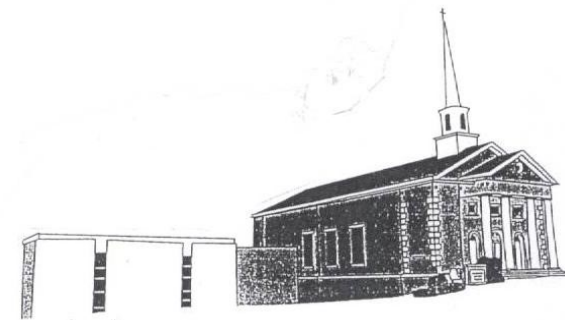
Thoughts From Doug

Alleluia! Christ is risen! I am so grateful for everyone who contributed their time and talents to make our celebration of the Resurrection so meaningful. Thanks to everyone who brought food for breakfast, and to Dave Brooks for the biscuits and gravy and grits. Thanks to Glenn Abbey for setting up the chairs and sound equipment for the Sunrise Service. Thanks to Sheila Lewis for adapting her young adult Sunday School lesson and so included several of our community youth who were present. Thanks to the choir for sharing, “Written in Red” as a contribution to our worship. And to Kellie Whipple and Kaitlin Tollison for singing at the Sunrise Service. And thanks to everyone else who shared in worship leadership. It was a beautiful day.

Now that we have completed a faithful observance of Lent in preparation for Easter, it is important what we truly celebrate Resurrection. The essential theme of Resurrection cannot be communicated in a day, so we will observe the seven weeks of Easter. Using the *Resource for Daily Prayer and Scripture Meditation* I prepared, we will follow the Lectionary readings that help us in this endeavor. For the upcoming Sunday (April 28), we will focus on the church as resurrected people. All around us, we see signs of a church shaped more by culture than by the biblical and early church principles of God’s community. Some churches have changed the way they worship simply because other churches have done so. The proof of the resurrection is not in a rational argument, rather, we are proof when we live as a community of resurrected people. It seems to me that the modern church signifies its culture rather than resurrection spirituality (see Acts 2:42-47). They lived the resurrected life. The key to church renewal is not strategy, as many church growth movements propose. The real key is for us to embody the resurrection. Churches that are corporate expressions of resurrection spirituality will attract and keep the unchurched. People are not kept in the church through gimmicks, entertainment, or even so-called relevance. What will renew the church is the communal experience of resurrection. I hope you will continue to pray for Hardwick Baptist. And I hope you will put feet to those prayers by committing to walk with your church family as together we follow the leading of God’s Spirit—because the Spirit will always lead us to be Resurrection People, not just people who celebrate Easter Sunday.

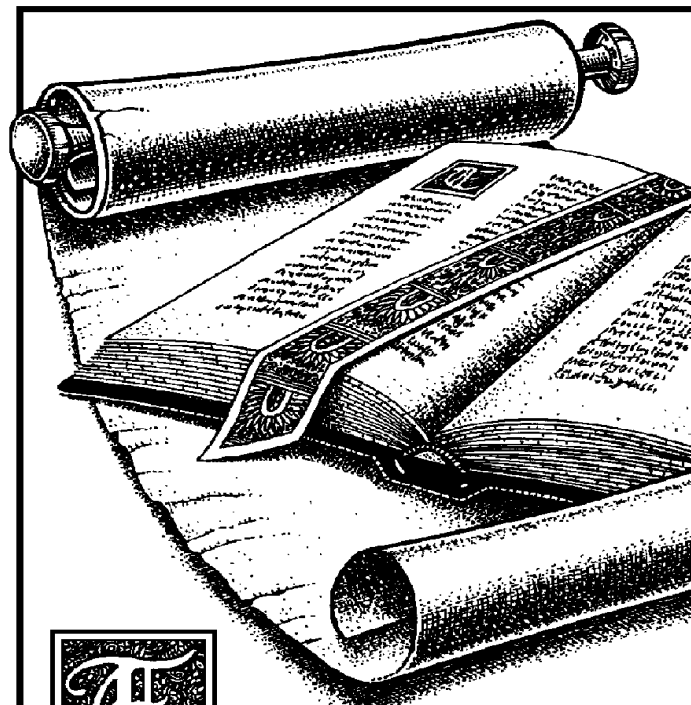
