The camp will involve four teams: Baldwin, Houston County, Jones County, and Spaulding county. As part of the camp, teams will attend an evening worship service at FBC Gray. Local churches have been asked to help feed the teams. Hardwick Baptist will be providing sandwich sack lunches for the Baldwin team on both days. We are responsible for making 50 sack lunches each day. Gloria Burke will be assembling some WMU members to prepare the lunches each morning, and Doug, Cindy, and Will will deliver them. Thoughts From Doug

In my sermon on May 26 (about Paul and Lydia), I discussed the necessity of a missional lifestyle. Just as Paul paid attention to the Spirit's leading in his life throughout his travels - so we need to be practicing a lifestyle that enables us to discern God's leading so that we might be faithful in following. This means paying attention with prayer each and every day. During that sermon, I discussed that, if we are learning to practice a *contemplative stance*, we can better trust that God's Spirit will be shaping us into people who are living missionally. The four steps to a contemplative stance were listed in the bulletin that day, and again June 2. For the benefit of all Hardwick members and friends, I am listing them here.

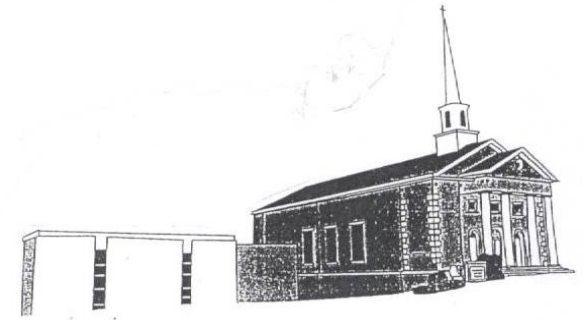
1. **SHOW UP** - Every day, show up to yourself, to God, to your neighborhood. Ask God to give you the grace and compassion to be present to those around you.
2. **PAY ATTENTION** - After you have shown up and been present to your surroundings, pay attention to where you sense God is inviting you toward something.
3. **LISTEN** - for God's invitation to cooperate with God in the work God is doing in individuals, our church, and our community.
4. **RELEASE THE OUTCOME** - After you have cooperated with God and neighbors, release the outcome into God's hands. Trust God to do the work that is transformational.

We see these steps throughout Jesus' life and ministry, as well as Paul and countless others. I encourage you to pray through these steps each and every day, and to be intentional in living into them. And when you have gotten in the habit of living this kind of missional lifestyle, hold on, because the Holy Spirit will be revealing to you more and more opportunities for you to be the presence of Christ in your world. And you will find yourself using gifts you never realized you had, doing things you never knew you could do, changing lives you never imagined. I truly believe that God is always moving in our midst, ready for us to jump on board and be blessed by being a part of what God is doing. And I truly believe that God is waiting for more of us at Hardwick Baptist to allow God to use us to fulfill God's dream for our neighborhood. I can't think of a more meaningful endeavor to give ourselves to!
