Baldwin High Football Team**

Thoughts From Doug

By now you have likely heard of the summer work our youth have begun at Comfort Farms. I realize not everyone is familiar with the farm, so I want to use this space to inform folks. I hope this will help you pray more intentionally for our work there. Comfort Farms was begun by Jon Jackson, retired US Army. Jon’s vision has been to create the nations’ first “Acute Veterans Crisis Agriculture Center.” The farm is named in memory of Army Ranger Captain Kyle Comfort, a friend of Jon’s who was killed in action in 2010. As stated on the farm’s website, the mission is to prepare veterans and students for careers in sustainable food production that integrates economic profitability, environmental stewardship, and healing through the use of “agri-therapy.” The farm serves veterans in acute situations where time and help are of the essence, with current lodging for up to two veterans (or one family). The goal is to provide shelter and therapy that allows veterans to regain strength and re-boot for everyday life and a fulfilling future. Founded in 2016, Comfort Farms provided crisis services for 20 veterans within the first year of operation. As a training campus, Comfort Farms also educated and assisted well over 500 veterans within the first year.

So that tells you a bit about where we are going this summer. The mission for Hardwick Baptist’s youth ministry is multi-dimensional.


1. We want our students to learn a little about gardening, and to better appreciate where their food comes from.
2. We want our students to understand the hard work that is behind food production.
3. We want to foster a deepened sense of community/teamwork among our students—so they have deeper bonds with each other, and take pride in accomplishing a task together.
4. We want our students to learn the Christian ethic of service—as they are volunteering their time over several weeks this summer.
5. We want our students to learn spiritual lessons and biblical truths that easily connect with growing plants, reaping what you sow, tending to God’s creation, stewardship of life, etc.

So, in a real sense, the youth who participate in the Wednesday night program will be experiencing several aspects of a mission trip—just in bits and pieces. I am grateful to Cindy Folendore for driving the bus picking up the students; for Will Cooper, who is preparing an on-site devotion for each week; for Marilynn Skinner, who has been accompanying us; for the good folks at Comfort Farms, especially Dan Tyler, a veteran who is guiding our students; and for our church family who are praying to this endeavor. I hope you will join me in hopefully expecting God to do a unique work among all involved—to grow a beautiful garden out of the combined efforts of this summer mission project.
