Thoughts From Doug

I am truly grateful for the meaningful time we shared last weekend. The Dawnings retreat was a wonderful experience for me. Hardwick Baptist was well represented at the retreat by these folks: Jim Davis, Lynn Batson, John Cooper, Sharon Lord, Marilyn Skinner, David Lewis, Brenda Davis, Tilda Cooper, Cindy Folendore, Nancy Veal, John Cooper, Sheila Lewis, Cindy English, Marguerite Folendore, Becky Adkins and Miles Whipple. I am so grateful for these who committed their time to this gathering. Bo Prosser and Harry Rowland have shared the vision of Dawnings with countless congregations, and we were blessed to have their leadership. As I have mentioned, Dawnings is not a program, it is learning to practice an intentional process - a process of discernment as we seek to listen together to the Spirit's leading. The process involves three movements: Visioning, Formation, and Engagement. In Visioning, we ask the question, "What are God's dreams for us and for the world?" In Formation, we ask the question, "How do we invite God to form us together around the vision God has revealed?" And in Engagement, we ask the question, "How do we join God to DO on earth as it is in heaven?" When we practice the Dawnings process of discerning the Spirit in our visioning, forming, and engaging, we notice a paradigm shift in our church. That is, we shift from *doing a church-shaped mission to becoming a mission (of God)-shaped church*.


Those who attended the retreat caught a glimpse of the Dawnings process. Please pray for Hardwick as we consider forming a Dawnings Team in the near future. This team would commit to meet (probably monthly) for ten sessions of learning and doing the Dawnings process. I feel strongly that this is a vital means by which we can learn, as a church family, to be a Spirit-formed church, rather than a program-driven church.

I also am grateful for Bo Prosser's presence for Sunday morning worship. His message was one of blessing to Hardwick Baptist Church. He blessed the people of this church - most still among us, some who have gone to Glory - for the amazing gift you gave to Bo and countless others who have been touched by your faithfulness to Christ. He reminded us how Hardwick Baptist set the trajectory for his life—that it was Hardwick's love and acceptance of all people during Bo's youth years that showed him a vision of church he has tried to live out his entire life. The vision is of a church where all are loved, where all are served and enabled to serve, and God's Spirit is allowed to form and shape each one as they discover and use their various gifts. Thank you, Bo, for blessing us with this reminder—and for challenging us to be that kind of blessing in our current community and world. What a wonderful legacy we are living into! Thanks be to God.
