Local churches have been asked to help feed the teams. Hardwick Baptist will be providing sandwich sack lunches for the Baldwin team on both days. We are responsible for making 50 sack lunches each day. Gloria Burke will be assembling some WMU members to prepare the lunches each morning, and Doug, Cindy, and Will will deliver them. For now, we are collecting contributions that will go toward the lunch supplies. 
Thoughts From Doug
