#### Thoughts From Doug

I am excited about the candidate for Interim Part-Time Music Director, whom the Personnel Committee will be recommending to the church on August 4. The job description has been changed from "Minister of Music" to "Music Director," as this individual will essentially be a choir director and worship leader (along with assisting me in worship planning each week). I feel that this candidate will excel in both areas. Next week I will say more about her specifically; for now, it is important that you know how we found her.

One thing I have learned in my years of ministry is to take advantage of the resources that are around you. Another way of putting that is: *Pay attention to where God has planted you. Notice the good gifts that are around you. Be a good steward of those gifts by utilizing them. And learn to partner with and support the good things that are going on around you.* Many churches are learning the value-the Christ-honoring value, I would say-of Asset Based Community Development. That means that, in planning our ministry and life as a congregation , we ask "What are the assets in our community-the gifts that God has placed around us through our neighbors and their life experiences?" An example of Asset Based Community Development is the partnership we have formed with Comfort Farms this summer. Our youth have contributed to some of the gardening at the farm, while also gaining valuable understanding about food production. They also have learned about the truth of resurrection-as Jon Jackson, the owner is doing life-giving work for veterans in memory of his soldier friend who was killed on the battlefield. Another example of Asset Based Community Development: I found Will Cooper through developing an intentional relationship with Emmanuel Little, who leads the "Call me MiSTER" program at Georgia College.


All of these lessons I have learned about Ministry and engaging the community came to play as we were searching for a Music Director. I learned from Chip Reeves, pastor at Community Baptist, how they had found a Music Director through the Georgia College Department of Music. I felt, in our efforts to "get the word out" about who Hardwick Baptist is, and what we are doing in this community, that it is essential for us to develop a relationship with folks on the campus. The college has a reputable music department. In the spring, after Dylan announced his move, I started making contacts with the music departments at GCSU and Mercer. I had a lunch meeting with Dr. Jennifer Flory, Choral Studies professor at GCSU (and Music Director at First Presbyterian Church). I told her our situation and gave her the job description. One former student immediately came to her mind: someone who had experience leading college ensembles, as well as campus ministry worship. Dr. Flory connected us and we soon set up a meeting with the Personnel Committee. The Committee is recommending her for a 3-month Interim.

I am excited about the possibility of this candidate and her enthusiasm in offering her gifts of music and worship and for the potential beginning of a relationship with GA College's Music Department. The more we can tell our story-the more students understand our heart for outreach-the more we can provide opportunities for them, like Will Cooper, to come alongside us and be the church with us.
