
Thoughts From Doug

I cannot begin to fully appreciate how my spiritual formation has been broadened and deepened by learning the significance behind various traditions and practices from the Church Universal that were not part of my Southern Baptist upbringing. I have come to believe that is very much like the benefit one receives from a good, wellrounded education. When it comes to education and schools, it appears to me that people's views are shaped by one of two ways that they approach the world: either from the lens of trust and faith, or the lens of skepticism and fear. People who are skeptical toward an honest, stretching education—at least in my experience—seem to operate out of fear. Anything that may challenge or contradict what they have been told or taught is labeled in all kinds of suspicious manners, among them: "strange," "foreign," or "liberal." On the other hand, people who come down on the side of faith and trust faith in God, that all knowledge comes from God; trust to follow human beings as we try to learn and live together—seem to operate with more openness and curiosity in learning about all of God's creation (including people and practices that may be "different" to them).

These approaches to education are also evident in our approach to our faith practices. My appreciation for learning from the traditions of the Church universal began in earnest on the foreign mission field, serving alongside missionaries from several denominations. That appreciation was greatly nourished at Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, where I was encouraged to seek to grow in my faith and my spiritual practices through a variety of manners that God's people have found meaningful. I especially am grateful for people like Dr. Glenn Hinson, who helped Baptist ministers in training appreciate the ancient church. My faith, and the faith of fellow Christians in churches I have served, has greatly benefited from some of those ancient ways of understanding what it means to be in relationship with God, through Christ, in the strength of the Holy Spirit. One such practice that stands out for me is the observance of Ash Wednesday—a service that helps Christ-followers to begin an intentional period of evaluating their faithfulness, or lack of, in recent months. All meaningful experiences in our life—weddings, birthdays, funerals—are marked by rituals that remind us of the grand significance and gifts of life. Ash Wednesday is one of those rituals that can help us enter into a time of walking more faithfully with Christ and with one another. I hope you will mark February 26, 6:15 PM, for Hardwick's Ash Wednesday service.


