

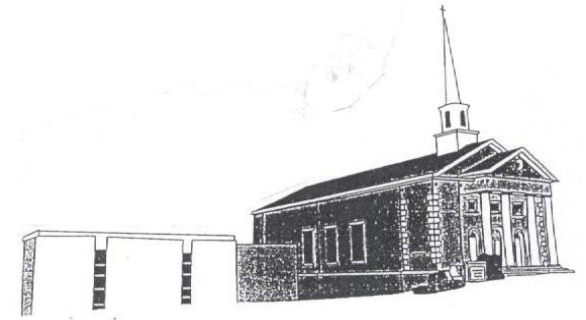
Thoughts From Doug

It would be insensitive or naïve not to address the obvious matter at hand in this week's article. Daily life has changed (or, at least it should have changed for those of us who care about others) drastically since last week's *Herald*. For the large majority of us, this is uncharted territory we are in. Ultimately, we do not know the full impact that COVID-19 will have on us—our social relationships, our families, our economy, our education, our livelihood, our worship life. First of all, I want you to be aware of the daily life and schedule of our faith community at Hardwick Baptist. We are, of course, honoring the requests that are coming from both state and national elected officials. We will not have any Wednesday ministries for the rest of March (meaning noon prayer meeting and evening children and youth ministry). We will not have Sunday School (any age group) on March 22 and 29. The church building will be closed on those Sundays., We will not be gathering as a congregation to worship at the sanctuary, but **we will still have worship**. Instead of gathering in one room at 124 Thomas Street in Hardwick, I encourage everyone to gather together virtually. We will be using our Facebook Live video streaming format so that you can participate and worship as a household. We will email copies of the order of service in advance so that you can follow along with the responsive readings and prayers and hymns. We will have all of the normal elements of worship, it is just that the congregation will be at home. You will hear the hymns sung by the hymn leader for the week, and you can sing along at home. You can join in prayer as the prayer is vocalized from the pulpit. We will have basically every element of the weekly worship service **except for the Offering**. Which brings me to a point that our Financial Secretary has asked me to emphasize. Please continue to be faithful in your regular contributions to the ministry of Hardwick Baptist Church, as we still have bills, salaries, utilities, and other expenses to keep up. If you have not yet set up an online giving account, you can do that through our church website. If for some reason you are not comfortable doing that, you have two options: you can either mail your contribution to the church office, or you can drop it by the office any weekday before 2:00 P.M. as the church office will remain open during this period unless otherwise announced.

We will update through the *Herald*, our Facebook page, and the website as to Sundays in April. Certainly we hope we can meet on Easter Sunday. In the meantime, we remember that it is our covenant as followers of Jesus to pray during this time; especially to pray for those who contract this virus, and healthcare workers who are putting themselves at risk. We pray for families who are having to make adjustments for childcare; for people who will lose their source of income for an extended time; and for elected officials who are responsible for making hard decisions, but ones that are done on behalf of all of us. I will still be at the church during the week, taking care of regular responsibilities. Please call me, as usual. We will use our best judgment concerning our interaction with each other in the coming days and weeks. But let us always claim what our faith teaches us, and what we will vividly be reminded of on Easter morning: *the worst things are not the last things*. And as someone else has said—**the Church cannot be cancelled; the Church can only adapt**. Thanks be to God!!

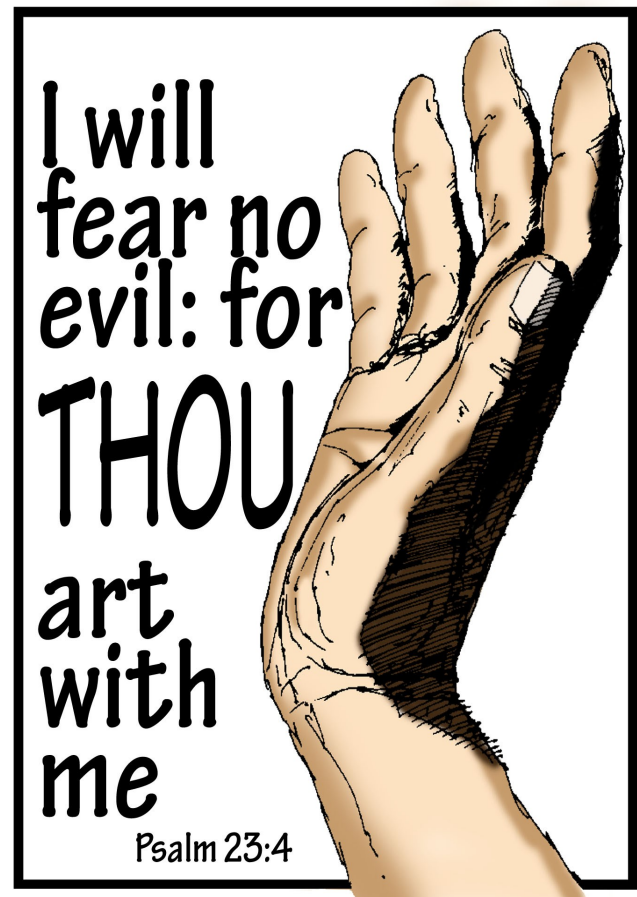

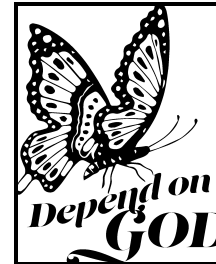
