

## Thoughts From Doug

Please be in prayer for our Properties Committee, the Finance Committee, and our Trustees, as they try to discover the best path forward regarding the issues with the church fellowship hall. As you are aware, the metal roof that was put on a couple of weeks ago did not fix the problem. The Properties committee described the leaking problem to all of the folks who gave us bids on roof repair. The quote which the committee settled on was not the cheapest, but it was not the highest, either. We were told that it would cover the roof and would drain properly. The Properties Committee, along with the Finance Committee, went with the bid, having been told that the metal roof would last 25 years or more.


Within a matter of days of the roof being completed, we experienced several days of rain—and soon, there were leaks that were worse than previous leaks. We have been told that the original roof was not level—there was a dip in it—and that the weight of the metal just exacerbated that dip. The more noticeable dip is now causing water to stand in several places, rather than draining, and water is still getting through. The folks who put the roof on have offered a solution: to jack up the roof ever so slightly—enough to where the dip will be corrected, returning it back to its original level. They have said they will do that at no charge; we would be responsible for damaged ceiling tiles and carpet.

Right now, the trustees and Properties Committee are seeking outside expertise. Miles Whipple has talked with contractors (not connected to our original roofers). He is also trying to locate a structural engineer. Our main concern is, while it is tempting to allow them to raise the roof at their expense, we want to get expert advice that such a move would correct the problem. Needless to say, we are skeptical about just depending on the opinions of the folks who put the roof on. And, if we feel that their offer is not the best choice, we have to find out how best to correct the problem.

So we need prayer—and we need expert opinions about next steps. The entire church owes a debt of gratitude to Miles Whipple. Miles was already a church trustee, and when Jim Davis left to be pastor at Mosleyville, Miles became the chair of the finance Committee. Miles has been putting in several “extra hours” in trying to obtain professional advice on what would be best for the Fellowship Hall, as well as the best use of the church’s finances. I told Miles a few days ago that the burden of going forward lies on all of our shoulders; it is not a burden that falls totally on him. I am grateful for his thoughtfulness and faithfulness in this matter.


