Thoughts From Doug



What an affirmation and encouragement for us! As I explained on Palm Sunday, this was my sign of Resurrection this year. Hardwick Baptist is doing amazing work—sharing God's love and grace with children and families in our neighborhood—and that work has not gone unnoticed. I hope this will encourage all of us to renew our commitment to faithfully support the work and ministry of our church—not only financially, but with our prayers and with the offering of ourselves to contribute to make our children's ministry, our food pantry, and Dinner Church all possible. Thanks be to God for God's faithfulness, and the faithfulness of God's people. Make sure you tell everyone you know about our church's efforts in this community; you never know when the word might spread to someone who has the same heart and resources as our anonymous donor.




