I hope you were able to watch John Lepper's video during last Sunday's morning worship on Facebook. I regret that there was an issue with the focus and sound of the footage that was recorded in the sanctuary. When our worship leadership team records this Friday, we will make sure there is clarity in video and audio before recording. Regardless of the technical issues, I trust that you were blessed by John's words of memories, as well as encouragement for the present. What a wonderful reminder about the impact of its beautiful fellowship and community that has been a hallmark of Hardwick Baptist. We hold onto those memories and that encouragement, especially during this time when we are not meeting in person.

The deacons held their May meeting this past Sunday via Zoom, and I wanted to update you on their conversation. After reviewing plans in several other churches, and considering the specifics of our congregation and the large number of confirmed COVID-19 diagnoses in our area the deacons are recommending that we continue to conduct worship and other meetings virtually through Sunday, June 14. The deacons will have a Zoom meeting on June 7 to discuss updated decisions for the rest of June and into July. This means that we will continue to have the current two weekly virtual meetings:

- 1. Sunday morning worship, viewed on the Hardwick Baptist Church Facebook page
- 2. Wednesday evening prayer service and discussion of one of the week's Scripture readings (via Zoom)

However we will also be offering a third weekly meeting via Zoom. I discussed the idea with the deacons yesterday I will attempt to describe it here. I have been thinking a lot recently about the image of a spiritual retreat, as I have been considering ways for us to grow spiritually during this time of quarantine. I have been fortunate to have experienced several spiritual retreats which have nourished me and stretched me in my faith journey. During a spiritual retreat, there usually is a theme, but not always. The purpose, though, is to have some extended time in quiet prayer, solitude, reflection on Scripture—all as opportunities to listen for the Holy spirit's guidance, insights, or revelations. Usually, for a retreat to be meaningful, a facilitator is needed.

What I want to encourage-challenge-you to do is to begin thinking of this time apart as an opportunity for you to experience aspects of a spiritual retreat. I will serve as the facilitator. I will provide questions to help you reflect on the Scriptures and how they speak to your current life. We will begin by using the lectionary readings for the week. I encourage you to spend time with the readings and the questions, and to ask God to speak into your life through them. We will have an hour Zoom meeting on Sundays at 4:30 PM to share insights from our "at home retreat." I will send the Zoom invitation via email on Thursdays. You can consider this as an evening Sunday School time as we walk through this quarantine.

Here are this week's readings, along with a question for you to spend time in prayer with:


Psalm 31: When was a time you were desperate to be rescued, saved, or freed from a situation? Acts 7:55-60: When have you forgiven someone whom others would have wished harm or vengeance?

I Peter 2:2-10: How do you relate personally in your daily life to people who are "nones" or unbelievers?

John 14:-1-14: Is the "dwelling place" of which Jesus speaks a place for us after we die, or does it include our life in the present? What does Jesus mean when he says that his disciples "will do greater works"? What does it mean to pray "in Jesus' name"? I hope you will join us for this valuable time of sharing and fellowship at 4:30 PM via Zoom.
