
Thoughts From Doug

The deacons had their June Meeting last week, with the main object of discussion being this: When we will resume in-person worship at Hardwick Baptist? I am devoting this week's article to share with you our tentative plans. I say tentative, because we all understand that, if there is a marked increase in more COVID-19 cases, we will adjust as deemed necessary. This is a time to proceed with caution, so if you are in the higher risk category, or feel uneasy about returning in four weeks, we encourage you to continue participating via Facebook, as we will continue with Facebook Live throughout. With that in mind, here are the precautions that have been developed by the staff and deacons, with insight from health officials and other churches who are resuming in-person worship. I will be sending this information via email, as well.

- Our first planned Sunday for resuming in-person worship is July 12.
- For the first two weeks, we will only resume Sunday morning worship.
- According to how things go, after those two weeks, we will consider having one big adult Sunday School class in the sanctuary, taught by one of the Sunday School teachers.
- For the first few weeks, we will not run our bus ministry for our children. We will continue to monitor things, as we discern when the appropriate time is to resume the bus ministry.
- We encourage all worshipers to wear a mask. We will have masks available if you
 do not have your own. If we all wear masks, we will be able to sing hymns. Hymnals have been removed from the pews for now; we will use the screen to project
 lyrics.
- We encourage you to arrive early for worship and to enter by the doors at the rear of the sanctuary (front steps of the church).
- We ask you to bring your own hand sanitizer, so that multiple people are not pumping from the same bottle.
- The water cooler and cups will be removed, for now.
- A box will be available for offerings, to deposit as you arrive or depart. You may also continue to give online or mail contributions to the church.
- *Physical distancing* will be modeled on the platform.
- We will ask our custodial service to do a deep clean in the sanctuary each week.
- Every other pew will be blocked off.
- Families will be encouraged to sit together; all others should be six feet apart
- Please observe one person at a time in the bathrooms, and only use those on the same level as the sanctuary.
- Bulletins will not be handed out, but will be set out on a table for worshipers to pick up as they arrive.
- Ushers will dismiss by rows, so that distancing can be maintained as we depart.

If there are other concerns you have that are not addressed in these guidelines, please call or email the church office with suggestions that we may have overlooked. We will review all suggestions, and consider adding them to this document as July 12 draws closer. Above all...continue to pray for our church family, and continue your faithfulness in being the Church, Christ's body, in all that you do while we are apart. I cannot wait to be with you on July 12.
