
Thoughts From Doug

After morning worship August 23, I ate lunch from my "Lunch box" I brought from home as I have been doing since we resumed in-person worship. I worked in my office for about 45 minutes, then left, heading to visit Lamar and Sallie Guy. I decided to drive down Park Avenue—towards Swint—just to see if I might see any of our Hardwick kids. And I was so glad I did. I noticed three of them walking up the street toward me. I stopped, with my window rolled down, and spoke to the first one. It was Chris, who used to "stay" not far from the church on Hardwick Street. He acted surprised to see me—since it had been so long. He reached his hand to shake mine (one of those times when I just had to put COVID precautions aside) and asked, "Pastor Doug—when are you all going to open the church back up?" There was part of me that was just heartbroken to hear that question. Heartbroken that we haven't seen our kids, for the most part, since the last week of February. That is six months—a whole half of a year! Heartbroken that they haven't been able to talk with their teachers/mentors at Hardwick Baptist about all that is going on in their minds and hearts during this pandemic. Heartbroken that we have not been able to provide our regular safe space for them to ask questions, to share their worries about their families and friends, to hear encouragement from us, and to help them recognize God's faithful presence in the midst of so much uncertainty and fear.

But there was another part of me that was so encouraged—that the first thing I heard was, "When is the church going to open back up?" I explained to them that we were having morning worship, but that we were not sure when we could start back our Wednesday night program and bus ministry. I told them that we would have to wait and see how the spread of the virus impacts the first weeks of school. But I also told them how much we missed them, how good it was to see them; and that we hoped to be together with them at church soon. Seeing them was a highlight of my day, if not the entire week ahead. It reminded me about the reality of what I said in Sunday's sermon. That is, the Church is to be driven by faithfulness to Christ. We are to be Spirit-driven, not market-driven.

If Hardwick Baptist Church had been a market-driven, mighty-dollar-worshiping congregation, we would have voted to move to market-friendly greener pastures over a decade ago. And if we had, we would be one of several churches on "church row," vying for folks on the lake who think they have everything they need, and would want us to impress them enough to convince them to cast their lot with us. Instead—thanks be to God—Hardwick Baptist had enough members years ago who cared more about following Jesus than following the money. If we had moved to Log Cabin Road, I can almost guarantee you, on a Sunday afternoon after pulling out of the church parking lot, I would not have run into African-American young men walking on the street who stopped and recognized me, and asked, "When is the church going to open back up?" I am thankful for the neighborhood in which we are located; for the faithful work that has been done in that neighborhood; and for the opportunities that are before us. It is our task to be faithful to that work. It is also our task to be intentional in telling about our ministry in the Hardwick Community, so that God's Spirit can speak to other Christfollowing hearts and call them to come join us. We do not have to wait until there is something closer to normalcy to be faithful. All we need to do is listen to that voice that tells us, "Why don't you take a different route home from church today and see what I put in your path?"


