At the September Deacons' meeting, we discussed our current weekly church schedule. I wanted to make sure that we have input from various people concerning our efforts to balance our desire and need to meet together as a church family with our love and care for each other regarding precautions that will safeguard people of all ages. We decided—at least for the rest of September—to continue "meeting" as we have the past couple of months. That is:


- 1. In-person worship Sunday mornings for all who feel it is appropriate for them to attend. At this time, a large majority of our congregation is still opting to stay home, which is understandable and wise for several of us. There is plenty of space available to physically distance in the sanctuary at this point if that factors into your decision regarding attendance.
- 2. Of course, we will still continue to stream morning worship on Facebook Live. We understand that, on some Sundays, we have had issues with dropping the internet connection. We are attempting to discover the cause and correct that.
- 3. We will continue to do Wednesday prayer meeting via Zoom and adult Sunday School via Google Meets. The Zoom link is emailed to the church email list weekly, the Google Meets information is printed in each week's *Herald* and the Sunday bulletins in the vestibule.

At both the Church Council meeting and the Deacons' meeting, discussion was devoted to our children's and youth ministry. We collectively expressed grief at the fact that circumstances still prevent us from resuming our Wednesday night and Sunday morning ministry with them. However, we did brainstorm around the question: Is there anything we can do for our kids that we are not doing now? The idea we decided to pursue is now an opportunity for you—an opportunity for **everyone** at Hardwick Baptist, whether you are confined to your home or have resumed most of your normal activities. We are going to work on compiling addresses for as many of our children as possible, which we hope to accomplish by the end of the month. Then, we are inviting our church family to commit to being a "pen pal" for one or two of our kids. This would likely involve sending a weekly note to your pal, along with an enclosed stamped envelope, encouraging your pal to write you back. You can include any kind of encouragement, Bible verses, etc., in your weekly notes. Hopefully, we can make use of unused Sunday School handouts at the church and include those in the mailings to our kids. We want to make every effort we can to remind them how much we miss them, and to encourage them to remember God's love is with them while we are apart. I am going to write a note to parents/quardians explaining all of this, and then mail it to them in a couple of weeks. After that, we will begin writing as many of our kids as possible.

I hope you will consider taking part in this ministry effort. It is one way we can still be the Body of Christ, loving our children even though we cannot see them. Watch for an email from me in the coming weeks, inviting you to serve in this simple, yet essential, way of walking in the manner of Christ.


