We also continue with the Zoom Wednesday prayer meeting and the Google Meet Sunday School class taught by Marilynn Skinner. Of course, we miss the weekly connection with our neighborhood kids, and Dinner Church that was just getting in the groove before COVID arrived like a tsunami.

All of these are things we are doing are what we felt were our best option during this time, and we will continue to be faithful to offering these as circumstances and prudence dictate. But I would ask you to pray for discernment about anything else we could be doing that would be both safe and needed. Particularly, I am speaking of outreach opportunities. Is there anything we could be doing, anything at the church or in the community, that would be a safe and needed means of being Christ's presence during this sheltered time? Is there a connection we could make with a school, a nonprofit, another local ministry that would be both meeting a need and helping people to know about the love and grace shared among the family of faith at Hardwick Baptist Church? Is there something we could offer—some service we could provide, some space we could let others use? Anything that would be a means of loving our neighbors, and helping others be reminded of God's love for them?

Will you pray with me about these matters? When the deacons and church council meet via Zoom this Sunday, I want to discuss possible ideas with them. In the meantime, if something comes to mind—or a particular individual whom we could help comes to mind please write it down. Email me or call either me or Cindy Folendore and pass it along to one of us. You never know what God's Spirit may plant in your heart, and how it might take root and produce fruit if we are faithful to act. We just need each other's help in making sure we are using sound judgment of caution and care during these precarious times. We need to take care of each other as we seek to care for those who are not part of our faith family.


