Thoughts From Doug

I am sitting in my office at Hardwick Baptist at 3:42 PM, Sunday, December 20. I typically bring a "lunch of leftovers" from home with me on Sundays, eat it after morning worship, then work in my office until 4:00 or so. Sundays roll around so quickly—just a few hours after this week's worship, I start thinking about next Sunday's service. I will leave the order of service for next Sunday on Elaine's desk before I head home, so that she has that first thing Monday morning. Elaine always has it ready for me on Tuesday morning, so I can edit and make any corrections. Like all jobs that involve the same weekly routine and responsibilities, it can get a bit monotonous. I have found that I need to read the Scripture lessons assigned for the next Sunday on Monday morning, so that they can be percolating in my mind and spirit. I will contemplate them on the drive to church, and pray with them in morning quiet time. I find, if I don't do that in advance, I am more likely to write a sermon for the next Sunday that is more informed by my mind and studies, and less informed by things I discern the spirit brings to mind and heart. When I am faithful to that routine, sermons are more of an opportunity for me to share something I have learned, some insight I have gained, something I believe God has revealed to me in my life and the Scriptures come alive as I seek to be open to what they have to say to today-to real life.

I say all of this because I think what I have described applies to paying attention to God in all of life, no matter who we are or what we do. And it especially applies to the season of Christmas. It is tempting to just get in the routine: "I know the drill; I know what Christmas is about and the story of Jesus' birth. I am just going to celebrate like every other year, do the gift shopping, send the Christmas cards, go to the Christmas Eve service. I will just try not to be too stressed out, and simply enjoy time with family." I honestly think that is the way in which many of us approach Christmas. But you have to be paying attention to God's messages that are all around you and within you. You have to be doing your own work of tending to the Christ that is in you. You have to pray and spend time in silent contemplation (pondering like Mary). You have to ask God to give you eyes to see and ears to hear the messages that God has for you this Christmas-which will be very different than the message you received last Christmas because life is different and you are different. Because that dear loved one has died since last Christmas, or you have given up on that long-held dream. You have to serve others in the name of Christ, and encounter them with the awareness that you are doing it unto Christ. Only then—only when you are following with such openness and trust that you can say with Mary, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be done unto me according to your will"; Only then will you find that indeed the Word has become alive for you and in you, because you are not simply celebrating Christmas according to the traditions of years past. Rather, you are experiencing the same wonder and miracle that was experienced by Mary 2000 years ago-because the Word is made flesh through you for the sake of the world.

That, dearly beloved, is hat I hope for you this Christmas.


