
Thoughts From Doug

It was so good to run into five of our Hardwick Baptist youth and children last week. Most of you probably know Jeremiah, Nehemiah, Kamari, Zanariah, and Kanayiah—siblings that have been "regulars" on both Wednesdays and Sundays over the recent years. Nehemiah was baptized at Hardwick Baptist less than three years ago, and all of them attended weekly before COVID put a temporary halt to our program. I had been to their home a few times prior to that, but the family moved over the summer—to a mobile home neighborhood just south of the church property. A letter was sent to them from the church office in early November—informing them about the Pen Pal Program. However, it was returned for some reason. Last Tuesday, before heading home, I decided to go look for them. I drove down their street, and there was no 125 street address—which told me we had the wrong address. I decided to drive further down the street, which led me to the mobile home neighborhood. And as soon as I drove on the property—I saw all five of the siblings walking alongside the pond. They came running to the car. I kept my mask on, but I could not resist giving them hugs. They were all bright-eyed and smiling, telling me how that morning they had met "Mr. Ken" at Wal-Mart for the Christmas shopping. They had gotten a gift of their choice, as well as a "necessity" or two (clothes, school supplies). And they asked, "Pastor Doug-when are we gonna come back to church?" I told them how much we miss them, and how I hoped that come early spring we would be able to resume some form of our ministry with them. They led me to their new home and I was able to speak with their mother. She was so grateful for the church's continued contacts with them, even if by phone calls or notes, or Christmas shopping.

That visit was as holy and as meaningful as anything that I experienced through these 12 days of Christmas. I hope the Hardwick family realizes their impact on our young people. I hope, also, that we realize how much they love us and miss times of love, warmth, worship, learning, and fellowship. I hope that all of us are experiencing a longing that is at a similar depth of our kids; that we al realize that we are not the same when we are not regularly with each other, offering prayers and songs together, eating together, worshiping together, studying together. I hope that we sense the incompleteness of not physically being the Body of Christ together. And in the meantime, I hope we continue to trust that God is growing us through our faithful living and service. Let's not take any of those blessings for granted.
